PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

HFR Veterans Return to Normandy

Four HFR veterans left Rochester recently on a two-week trip to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the D-Day landings. Their trips were paid for by the Greatest Generation Foundation and College of the Ozarks.

The veterans include John Cipolla, John (Jack) Foy, Joseph (Joe) Mack who landed on Omaha Beach on D-Day, and Louis (Lou) Masciangelo who served in the U.S. Army Air Corps, 8th Air Force, 389th

Bomb Group. This will be the first time that Joe Mack has returned to Omaha

beach since he landed 70 years ago and where he watched his best friend die.

John Cipolla parachuted into France 15 miles behind enemy lines as a member of the 101st Airborne from a C-47 troop transport similar to *Whiskey 7* (see story on page 3). He still has the "cricket" device which was used to distinguish between friends and the enemy. Later, John was part of the outnumbered forces defending Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge.

Jack Foy did not land at Normandy but served under General Patton during the Battle of the Bulge. The four men will also tour Battle of the Bulge sites, and are expected to meet President Obama during the D-Day ceremonies.

Whiskey 7's Return to Normandy

volunteers attended a May 15th luncheon and program at the National Warplane Museum in Geneseo. The attendees watched the takeoff of Whiskey 7 (below) on its historic return to France as part of the 70th Anniversary of D-Day. It is one of the few remaining WWII-era planes capable of making the transatlantic trip.



Whiskey 7, a Douglas C-47 troop transport plane, was the lead ship of the 37th Troop Carrier Squadron which dropped members of the 82nd Airborne Division near St. Mère-Église in the early hours of June 6, 1944. Whiskey 7 and its crew will reenact that mission by dropping members of the Liberty Jump Team at various locations (original D-Day drop zones) from June 4th until June 9th.
