Mission 63, October 20-21, wrapped up our 10th Anniversary year. HFR Mission 63 consisted of 48 men and women veterans taking their honor flight trip to Washington, D.C. over the weekend. The veterans served in all branches of the U.S. armed forces during World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Cold War era, and Women Army Corps. (WAC).

On Sunday, April 7th, we welcomed home Mission 64, the first mission of 2019! The 57 Veterans included 6 World War II veterans, 31 Korean War veterans, 15 Cold War veterans and 5 Vietnam veterans. Veteran Memories—Nick Verzella

Nick Verzella served in the Army from 1944-1946 as part of the 78th Infantry Division. He landed at Le Havre, spent a lot of time guarding German prisoners after V-E Day, and was part of the Occupation of Berlin. One time Nick was awakened after completing a 12am - 3am shift on a guard tower and told that the CO wanted to see him. Apparently 13 prisoners had tunneled out right under his tower. Eventually they determined that the escape had happened on the watch after Nick's, so he was off the hook. Nick traveled to Europe in 2003 to visit all of the places he had been during the war and said Berlin is so beautiful now compared to the total devastation then.

The only times Nick has not lived in his native East Rochester are when he was serving in the Army during WWII and when he attended Brockport State College. Nick became a teacher by happenstance—one day when he and a group of guys were hanging around a street corner after the war, Fred Durante, the brother of a friend, approached him and told him, "You would make a good teacher. You should think about teaching." Fred added, "I will take you out to



Brockport, enroll you, and find a place for you to live." Nick hemmed and hawed but Fred persisted. Eventually Nick told him, "I'll do it, but I want to take three of my buddies, too." True to his word, Fred drove all four and got them enrolled. Of the four who went to Brockport, two became principals and one a superintendent. Nick worked in the ER school district for 39 years as an English teacher, coach (baseball and basketball), principal, and interim superintendent. Shortly before Fred's



death, Nick visited him in the hospital and told him he was going to talk about him in the upcoming graduation speech he was going to give.

While his teaching and coaching career was certainly rewarding, Nick says his true calling has been ensuring that the fallen warriors from ER's Gold Star families (49 war deaths: 8 WWI, 34 WII, 5 Korea, 2 Vietnam) are not forgotten. Nick has accomplished this goal through school assemblies and Memorial and Veterans Day speeches. In each tribute, he eulogizes one veteran, after spending up to 2 months doing reading and research about him. For this work and other efforts on behalf of veterans, Nick was inducted into the NYS Veterans' Hall of Fame in June of 2011 and the gazebo in Edmund Lyon Park bears his name. He is currently working with the Village Administrator and Legion Commander to have a monument in the Station of Heroes for ER's sons and daughters, all volunteers, who have served in the military since 1975 when the draft ended.

Nick traveled with HFR on

M31 in 2013 with his friend Charlie Barranco. Nick had already been to the WWII Memorial in 2006 and didn't want to "take someone's spot", but



Charlie and Jean Kelly talked him into it. Debbie Hurd was his guardian and Nick says the trip "was the best thing that ever happened". He was surprised by all of the midshipmen at BWI and says it reminded him of being engulfed by the French on V-E Day.

Nick met his late wife Dorothy at Brockport and they married after his graduation in 1950 (BS and MA degrees). They have two grown children, Jeff, a physician who lives in Williamsport, PA, and Lisa, a classical



musician, meteorologist, and hang glider who lives in Salt Lake City, along with three grandchildren. In addition to his talks (about 5 big ones each year), Nick keeps busy playing golf, working out at the gym, going to the theater, and reading.

Help Wanted

Health and Safety Coordinator (reports to VP Mission Logistics)

Responsible for all safety and health processes and procedures to enable a safe trip for all Veterans and others who travel and participate on an Honor Flight.

- Supports a team of qualified volunteers to gather and review veteran medical information and ensures veterans are properly characterized in terms of the health requirements

- Defines specific veteran safety requirements including oxygen for a Mission

- Ensures safety personnel are available at Departure and Welcome Home

- Reviews and maintains master veteran flight safety roster

- Provides training to Mission Safety crew members

- Defines and updates Mission Medical and Emergency processes

- Updates Guardian Training Package as needed

- Medical Credentials Required

Mission Safety Equipment Coordinator (reports to VP Mission Logistics)

Responsible for ensuring all necessary medical supplies and equipment are ready prior to each mission
Responsible for transporting safety bags back to the Legacy after each mission and restocked

Events/Booths Coordinators

- Honor Flight Rochester participates in a wide variety of events, festivals, etc. Volunteer coordinators are needed to coordinate HFR booth activities with the event host and HFR volunteers

- Coordinators plan HFR participation, be the point of contact for HFR for the event, schedule volunteers identified via surveys, provide merchandise requirements to Merchandise Quartermaster, set up tear down of booth and account monetary results

Newsletter Editor (reports to VP Volunteer Resources)

- Develops 4-6 volunteer newsletters per year

- Solicit content and engage appropriate review before publishing

- Experience with design and layout tools (Microsoft Publisher, etc.) is needed and must have access to appropriate tools (for layout and photo editing)

- Must have basic photo editing skills (cropping, adjusting brightness, etc.) and basic web search skills are also needed

- Must have the ability to output newsletter to a PDF file and possess good organizational and writing skills

Merchandise Quartermaster (reports to Events Coordinator)

- Responsible for defining array of HFR branded mer-

chandise and apparel offered in exchange for donation - Single point for purchase or re-order of all merchandise, and apparel

- Tracks and maintains inventory at storage location

- Builds kits of merchandise and supplies as requested

by Event Coordinator for specified events

- Supports Events, Donations Coordinator, and Welcome Home

Survey Monkey Coordinator (reports to VP Volunteer Resources)

- Responsible for staging and sending the volunteer surveys via Survey Monkey
- Provides results of surveys in an organized fashion and in a timely manner to the event leader and the event coordinator
- Resolves issues with failed deliveries and email address problems
- Provides feedback to the VRC gmail coordinators for volunteer master roster updating
- Experience with Survey Monkey desired and experience with Excel spreadsheets is a must

School Mail-Call Liason

HFR encourages student involvement through schools participating in the Honor Flight Mail Call initiative. Over 40 schools take part in writing letters to our veterans who receive them when their flight departs Rochester Saturday morning. This is a wonderful tribute to our senior veterans for their sacrifice and service from students in the younger generations. Each veteran receives over a half dozen personalized letters which have been written as part of their school curriculum.

- Works with teachers and school groups in writing personalized letters to veterans on each mission.

- Schedules multiple schools for each mission and pick up and organize letters.
- Schedules presentations for schools.
- Connects experienced educators with new participants to assist with lesson strategies.

Grateful For The Title "American"

As the bands march by, playing Yankee Doodle, and, I hope the Battle Hymn of the Republic, do you see their ghosts in their many uniforms trudging by, and hear the rumble of artillery in the distance?


