BOB FERGASON (M28) SHARES INDEPENDENCE DAY PARADE MARSHAL'S DUTIES ON WITH PRESIDENT RICH STEWART

This past summer President Rich Stewart visited with M28 flown veteran Robert "Bob" Fergason at his Penfield home that he built in 1953. Bob agreed to share the Parade Marshal's duties at Penfield's Independence Day Celebration.

Bob's WWII service was from 1943 to 45 in the India-China-Burma theater with the 758th Railway Shop Battalion. His outfit was sponsored by the Santa Fe Railway. His rail road shop was in Dibrugarh, Assam province inland and north of Calcutta. The surrounding rail lines moved large amounts of guns, ammo, food and supplies. Most everything came in from Australia into the port of Calcutta then by rail 250 miles north. The trains ferried across rivers and the route even had different gauge track sizes, all contributing to very challenging levels of difficulty. From Assam province those critical war supplies were loaded into planes to fly over the hump.




Bob Fergason and President Rich Stewart in a mint condition 1950 Chrysler Windsor Convertible.

The Railway Operating Battalions of the U.S. Army Transportation Corp were necessary to keep the trains running. They made parts for the locomotives at Bob's shop. He designed and machined both engine and train parts on lathes. His pre-war design courses at RIT were perfect background.

During Bob's first year in India supplies were meager and he was allotted one can of beer for that year. The second year was a bit better and he had two cans of beer. Bob does recall a USO show featuring Hollywood stars Pat O'Brien and Jinx Falconburg. In those early USO shows Hollywood was highly patriotic.

Bob continues to be highly self-sufficient a trait inherited from his father. Bob came of age during the Depression just before WWII. Bob is a member of the "Greatest Generation."
