### WE LEAVE NO VETERAN BEHIND

## VETERAN SALUTE BARNEY MULHOLLAND

It's highly unlikely that enthusiastic youth Barney Mulholland had any idea what he was in for when he emigrated to USA from County Down, Northern Ireland. Surely, his thoughts were on what would be his life in Brooklyn; in fact, it's quite certain his vocabulary did not include Ulithi, LST, Typhoon, or Kamikaze. But lad Barney was to experience the hell of war, and then reap blessings from it.

With the Second World War well underway while Barney was in high school, he wanted to stand and serve his new country. In general, he was too young, however, the US Navy offered which was called a "Kiddie Cruise" [Editor's note: rather a misnomer given that it was 1942] in which young men could sign up for the Navy at 17 years of age, and after graduation serve only three years rather than the normal four.

And thus, Barney Mulholland did enlist in the US Navy. Immediately the recruit was



sent for training at Sampson Naval Training station on the shores of Seneca Lake. Subsequently, he was sent to Wentworth Institute of Technology in Boston for training on shipboard mechanics.

Things were going well for Barney, until one day he was called into his commander's office. It seemed that Mr. Mulholland, they had discovered, was of questionable citizenship. It was suggested that being a citizen of Northern Ireland, he could join the British Navy. Or, he could go to the courthouse, raise his hand, take an oath, and become a US citizen. Which is exactly what he did, a process which Barney describes as "immediate" in achievement.

Barney Mulholland's first shipboard assignment was on DD-744 Blue a 376 foot long destroyer with five-inch guns and capable of 34 knots. Following the shakedown cruise though, Blue went to the Pacific, and Barney was sent for HVAC training at Carrier in Syracuse, NY. Barney stayed assigned to Blue and was reunited at Ulithi Atoll in what is now Federated States of Micronesia.

During his service aboard, Blue participated in multiple raids, including against the Japanese mainland, as well as the assault of Iwo Jima. Despite Iwo Jima battles sinking two ships and damaging sixteen more, Blue suffered only one injury, that from friendly fire. And, despite Iwo Jima being widely recognized as a horrific battle, Barney really doesn't have much to say about it. What does stick in Barney's mind is the Typhoon of June 1945 during which ships were lost and the almost-700 foot long heavy cruiser Pittsburgh lost her bow. Most impressive of the memories, Barney reports, was being on the bridge of Blue and looking UP at the destroyer in front of them, with the screws (propellers) hanging free in the air!

In mid-1945 Barney was transferred stateside as a candidate for Officer Training School, where he (as he says) "flunked out" due to being far-sighted. Which was of no particular impact, since the war had just ended. In 1946, 21 year old, American citizen Barney Mulholland was discharged from US Navy. But life is mysterious. While he had been on the train to OTS, Barney met Alvin "Bum" Wicke, a torpedoman from the destroyer Brush which had been in same task group as Barney and Blue. Alvin had also been passed over for OTS, so with shared experiences they quickly became fast friends. Not long after they were discharged, Alvin visited Barney in Brooklyn. In return, Barney visited Alvin in Kentucky, and was quickly taken by Alvin's sister Mary.

Barney married Alvin's sister Mary Wicke, whom he describes as "the highlight of my life." And though Mary passed in 2018, the couple raised eight wonderful, successful children. Barney's postwar marriage and family spun his perception of the Second World War, "War is very bad. It is not pleasant, it is not like John Wayne. But good things come of it. A sad time in the world worked out very well for me."

Barney joined Honor Flight Rochester Mission 47, accompanied by his daughter Kathy Parinello. Barney notes that he was misty-eyed through the entire trip. The opportunity to reunite with WW2 vets, to see the Vietnam, Korea, and especially the WW2 memorial was touching. Barney describes the Welcome Home greeted by hundreds as "tremendous, and quite an experience."

We honor and thank Barney Mulholland and those like him who served our country. Honor Flight Rochester volunteers and sponsors know that Mission 47 wasn't the #1 experience in his life, but we certainly hope it was #2.
