

# **Check Out Our New Website!**

About 2 years ago, HFR President Rich Stewart called me to discuss something he wanted to add to our website (www.HonorFlightRochester.org). Not having my computer nearby, I brought up the website on my phone, only to be astonished at how poorly it rendered. When I thought more about that, it made complete sense since the website was about 12 years old by then.


As an IT/Database Coordinator at the time, I recommended that we undertake a complete website redesign to achieve a more modern look and compatibility across various device types (e.g., phones and iPads), and after making a presentation to the board and getting some rough estimates, the project was approved and I put a team together. Our first step was to look at websites for many other HF hubs and non-profit organizations. Then we evaluated various design options, decided on the website pages and content, and put a specification together for going out to local website developers for bids.

I am very happy to report that our new website was moved into production on 1/14. Besides the responsive design that adjusts to a user's device, the new website features many photos; updated forms for veteran, guardian, and volunteer applications; a Frequently Asked Question (FAQ) page; and an updated Contact page. Our new Missions page shows information about upcoming and past missions—look there a few days before any mission for details on the upcoming Welcome Home. The header on each website page has quick links to access our Social Media sites (Facebook and Instagram) and our Shutterfly albums which contain mission and event photos.

Thanks to my great team (Fon Sakulsurarat, Shelly Sulenski, Jill Yanus) for their hard work, significant contributions, and dedication to this project. Thanks also to the board for supporting this project.

### **Be Your Real ID Self**

The Real ID Act, passed in 2005, establishes and ensures that minimum security standards are in place and enforced for state-issued ID-type cards. Because of this Act, effective May 7, 2025, all adult airline passengers 18 and older must show a Real ID at airport checkpoints in order to fly. This includes all Honor Flight Rochester veterans, guardians, and mission staff.

What is a Real ID? DMV-issued driver license, learner permit, or non-driver ID that's federally compliant. It allows you to fly domestically and enter certain federal buildings. An enhanced photo document does not replace the Real ID.

**Valid Forms of ID** 

- State-issued Enhanced Driver's License
- U.S. passport or U.S. passport card
- DHS trusted traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. Department of Defense ID, including IDs issued to dependents
- · Permanent resident card
- Border crossing card
- An acceptable photo ID issued by a federally recognized Tribal Nation/Indian Tribe
- Enhanced Tribal Cards (ETCs).
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada card
- Transportation worker identification credential
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Employment Authorization Card (I-766)
- U.S. Merchant Mariner Credential
- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)

Does your NYS ID or driver's license have a star or flag on it? If yes, you DO have a Real ID. If not, you'll need to apply and receive a Real ID in order to fly before May 7, 2025.

Does a passport still work if you don't have a Real ID by May? Yes, a valid US passport will work in place of a Real ID.

**Is there an additional cost?** No, there is no additional fee for a Real ID and all standard transaction fees apply at the DMV.
